A RARE BEGINNING

JERE GETTLE always had a passion for growing things, and at age 3 he planted his first garden. Ever since, he wanted to be involved in the seed industry. So in 1998, at the age of 17, he printed the first Baker Creek Heirloom Seed catalog. The company has grown to offer over 1,000 varieties of vegetables, flowers, and herbs—the largest selection of heirloom varieties in the USA.

Baker Creek carries one of the largest selections of seeds from the 19th century, including many Asian and European varieties. The company has become a tool to promote and preserve our agricultural and culinary heritage. Our company and seeds have been featured in *The New York Times*, The Associated Press, *Oprah Magazine*, NPR, *Martha Stewart, The Wall Street Journal*, and many others. Gardeners can request a free color catalog. Our catalogs now distribute to over one million gardeners nationally.

Baker Creek began hosting festivals in 2000 as a way to bring gardeners, homesteaders, and natural food enthusiasts together to exchange ideas and seeds, to listen to speakers and to enjoy vendors, old-time music and much more. These festivals gave birth to the idea for our pioneer village, Bakersville. Other projects include our trial gardens that we grow each year, seed collecting expeditions, and educational produce exhibits.

Over the last decade, Jere Gettle and his wife, Emilee, have branched out into other related projects as well. They have also expanded into a location in Sonoma County, California, in the beautiful town of Petaluma, and worked on the restoration and preservation of

the landmark Comstock, Ferre & Company in Wethersfield, Connecticut. This business now has new owners who are continuing the great tradition.

The Gettles have published two books with Hyperion. These books feature heir-loom vegetables and their work with seeds and food. After publishing *The Heirloom Life Gardener* in 2011, they released



The Baker Creek Vegan Cookbook in 2012.

Jere and Emilee also work extensively to supply free seeds to many of the world's poorest countries, as well as here at home in school gardens and other educational projects. It is their goal to educate everyone about a better, safer food supply and fight gene-altered "frankenfood" and the companies that support it.

Our work would not be possible without the international network of friends and associates who seek out and grow the most rare and exciting varieties from around the world.

Jamaica Connection

In Jamaica, Richie Ramsay has expanded his operation to include a team of horticulturists. Shernicia Brown-Briscoe, Kadeen Cruckshank, and Rosemarie Brown work with the Baker Creek customer care team to answer questions about gardening. At a farm in Linstead, Ricardo Harrison, Daniel Clayton, and Deroy Henry-Magyver help Richie produce seeds for Baker Creek, including a large crop of luffa gourds, as well as Peach Carolina Reaper and Scotch Bonnet hot peppers, and butterfly peas.

"This year we've invested a lot in seed production and processing," Richie said. He acquired a seed processing machine from Baker Creek that has made removing seeds much easier and quicker.

Growing in India

Dr. Avtar Singh began his career in seed production in 1985. Because there was no public internet in those days, he relied on copies of Seed World magazine from the university library to help him develop his business. We met Avtar about 10 years ago, through the late Richard Bernard, an international seed expert.

At his Beauscape Farm, in the Punjab region of northern India, Avtar does breeding work and trial growing. He developed a unique, fast-growing strain of moringa, the highly nutritious and prolific superfood. He also works with a large group of contract growers who together produce flower and vegetable seeds on about 4,000 acres.

Among the many beautiful

varieties Beauscape provides are Kajari and Hara Madhu melons, Durgesh 41 cauliflower, Double Yellow coreopsis, Pusa Asita carrot, and Pusa Gulabi radish.

"This is not just my business, it is my passion," Avtar said.

Connecting the Dots in Japan

The Baker Creek Japan team – Rob McGuinness, Mayumi Nasu, and Mark Wideman – continued their search for exciting new Japanese varieties, particularly flowers, in 2024. They also continue working to raise Baker Creek's profile in Japan.

"We're making a lot of headway with brand recognition," said project manager Rob McGuinness. "Baker Creek is surprisingly well known here; we meet a lot of people who are already big fans."

The team acts as a bridge between Baker Creek and Japanese seed companies and breeders to acquire seeds for grow-out and breeding projects.

The team has continued to build relationships with chefs, both high profile and lesser known, to develop recipes using heirloom vegetables.

Eventually, Baker Creek hopes to establish a research and growing center in Japan and, in time, establish a retail operation for Baker Creek seeds.

Seed Hunting in India

Our friend Avinash Gune in Pune, India, is dedicated to seeking out the most beautiful and delicious heirlooms India has to offer. We are pleased to offer several of Avinash's contributions in 2025, including Paal Cheera (White Beauty) amaranth, a delightful variety from Kerala, in South India, with pearlescent white stems and green leaves, as well as three new eggplant varieties including Illikomban, a long, slender green eggplant from Onattukara, South Kerala, that grows to two feet long. We are also pleased to offer Niranajan Bhata eggplant, another long eggplant with a sweet, refined flavor and vigorous growing habit.

Avinash began ordering seeds from Baker Creek in 2015 and has become an important part of our global seed team.

European Connection

Yoshito Tajima is Baker Creek's representative in Europe, making connections with breeders, seed companies, and growers to source new and exciting varieties for customers. Yoshito spent much of his childhood in Paris, where his first gardens were grown on the balconies of his family home.

Seed Farming in Kenya

Samuel Kangethe is the founder of Community Empowerment through Sustainable and Bio-Intensive Agriculture (CESBA) in Kenya. Samuel is also an alumnus and board member of MESA, Multinational Exchange for Sustainable Agriculture, where he trained in agroecology, bio-intensive agriculture, and urban farming techniques. In addition to his community education work, Samuel is trialing Kenyan heirloom varieties and growing seeds for Baker Creek.

In Petaluma, she has guided the store through two catastrophic regional fires, a downsizing and move, and the COVID pandemic. She earned Master Gardener badges in California and Connecticut.



ABOUT OUR SEEDS

All our seed is non-hybrid, non-GMO, non-treated, and non-patented. We do not buy seed from Bayer-owned Seminis, and we are not members of the pro-GMO American Seed Trade Organization. We source our seeds from our seed production fields, our network of growers, and other trusted companies.

We practice strict adherence to the Federal Seed Act, which requires that we test the germination rate of all lots of seed we sell. While different crop types have different minimum germination rates, all must test at or above the type's minimum standard or be labeled otherwise. Our staff regularly samples the approximately 4,000 lots of seed and coordinates with testing labs, then tracks, records, and reports the results internally. No seed is packed without a germination report.

We try not to sell seeds with germination below the minimum federal standard, but in certain cases, such as low inventory or high customer demand, we will overpack the seeds and clearly label the packets as "overpacked due to low germ," along with the germination rate and the month and year of the test result.

Additionally, we grow all the offered seed varieties in our gardens and greenhouses and assess qualities such as flavor, hardiness, growing profile, and whether they grow true to type.

We take our seed program seriously, and we want our customers to get the best seeds possible.

CENTERING THE SEEDS



The Heirloom Market at Comstock Ferre, in Wethersfield, CT, combines a cafe and grocery with locally roasted coffee, fresh pastries, and a generous side of Baker Creek seeds, all in a beautifully restored historic landmark building.

Baker Creek purchased Comstock, Ferre & Co., the country's longest continuously operating seed company, in 2010, renovating the property in the heart of Old Wethersfield. In 2016, Spiro and Julia Koulouris began leasing the building for their cafe and grocery but kept the seeds. They bought the property in 2020.

"We're a couple of people who never sold seeds, but now it's engrained in the business," Spiro said. "The biggest pushback we got when we moved into the building was 'there goes the seeds," he said. "Just allowing us to sell their product ... was a major contributing factor to maintain the trust of the community."

Spiro also says that Baker Creek's restoration of the Comstock Ferre property helped to spark a revitalization in the neighborhood.

"I tell people the town of Wethersfield owes the Gettles a debt of gratitude," he said.

PETALUMA SEED BANK



The location may have changed – Baker Creek's Petaluma store moved down the street from the old Sonoma County National Bank building a few years ago - but the mission remains the same: to provide gardeners with a top-notch experience featuring a a full selection of seeds, plus tools, books, and gardening supplies.

"The thing I love most about working at the seed bank is the opportunity to teach, to research and solve problems or answer questions, and help people garden at whatever level they are at," said General Manager Ellyn Malvawalla.

AGASTACHE

Fragrant plants are perfect for tea



(Agastache ssp.) We offer a great selection of fragrant and showy agastache. The colorful flowers of these tender perennial herbs are a favorite of hummingbirds, butterflies, and bees. Drought-tolerant plants enjoy a sunny location and thrive in low-fertility soils. Most of these make incredible tea.



ANISE HYSSOP #HB122 (A. foeniculum) Beloved by pollinators and tea aficionados alike. A perennial that blooms in the first year, it is hardy from USDA zones 4-8. The leaves and flowers are used to make one of the best herb teas; the foliage possesses a naturally sweet, wonderful anise taste and fragrance. Pretty purple flower spikes that bees love! Pkt (125 seeds) \$3.00



FRAGRANT DELIGHT MIX #HB315 (A. aurantiaca) Perennial in zones 6-10, typically grown as an annual. Deliciously fragrant flower spikes in apricot, grape, and raspberry colors! Prepare for the buzz of a diversity of beneficial insects and hummingbirds! Pkt (35 seeds) \$4.00





TEXAS HUMMINGBIRD MINT"HEATHER QUEEN" #HB272 (A. cana) Plants fill the air with minty fragrance; the pretty spiked flowers are popular for arranging. This dynamic landscape plant is easy to grow, adds long-season color, and grows in neat clumps that do not spread or take over. Hardy, overwinters from zones 6a-9b, but can be easily grown farther north as an annual. Pkt (25 seeds) \$3.50



LAVENDER MARTINI

#HB322 (A. aurantiaca)

Perennial in zones 6-10, or grow

as an annual. Plants are perfectly

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APRICOT SPRITE #HB321

(A. aurantiaca) Perennial in zones 6-9 (otherwise grow as an annual). Set off a blazing display of tangerine-colored fireworks in your garden with this phenomenal, fragrant agastache. This native wildflower's blooms appear in mid to late summer. Plants reach 15 to 18 inches tall and about 24 inches wide. Pkt (35 seeds) \$4.00

AMARANTH

New World native adds lots of color to the garden. This crop is easy to grow and makes delicious greens and grain. A good ornamental plant for landscaping. Amaranth seed is one of the most complete proteins available from any plant. Direct sow the tiny seeds when soil is warm, barely covering, and thin to 1-2 feet apart. It can also be started indoors and transplanted. (100-200 seeds per packet)



PINK BEAUTY #AM114 A powerhouse of nutrition and very heat tolerant for summer. The tender, bright pink stems and soft, glossy green leaves make this a gourmet spinach substitute. It hails from southern India, where you can find these greens sliced into ribbons and stir fried with chilies, garlic, curry leaf, and grated fresh coconut. The greens are endlessly versatile, and we enjoy them raw and cooked. Pkt \$3.50



GOLDEN GIANT #AM117 The attractive golden-colored flower heads produce up to 1 pound of white seed per plant, making this a very heavy producer of seed. These seeds are high in protein, and they can be cooked in a number of ways: popped like popcorn, stewed into porridge, and more. Young leaves are also tasty as cooked greens. Plants grow to about 6 feet and are easy to grow. **Pkt \$3.00**



BEETROOT AMARANTH #AM110

A delicious ornamental edible jewel from southern India, its lush red foliage is as vibrant as rangoli art, providing bold burgundy tones in the flower garden and a tasty alternative to spinach in the vegetable patch. Like all amaranths, the leaves are tender and best used in stir fries, or cooked into daal or masalas. **Pkt \$3.50**



CHINESE MULTICOLOR SPINACH #AM105 A heat-

and drought-tolerant green in spectacular splashes of color! This leafy "spinach" amaranth is popular in Asia, eaten raw, stir fried, or steamed. This is by far the most tender and sweetest amaranth. The young leaves are a perfect spinach substitute; the intricately colored leaves are juicy and succulent. This is the go-to "green" for midsummer when all others have bolted, and can be harvested just 30-40 days from sowing. **Pkt \$3.50**

ARUGULA

Pesto, pasta, pizza, and great salads

A miscellary of crops is offered under the name Arugula, yet they all tantalize our taste buds with their peppery and exciting flavors! This relative of the mustard family is easy to grow and amazingly nutritious. In addition to the flavorful leaves, the flowers & seed pods are also edible! (200-600 seeds per packet)



WASABI ARUGULA #OG132 (Diplotaxis erucoides) About 35 days to maturity. For those chasing the unmistakable tingle and mouth-watering flavor of true wasabi, look no further than the Wasabi arugula. This leafy crop is becoming popular in Japan and is a new star of the U.S culinary scene. This short and stout plant is quick to mature, but also fairly quick to bolt; sowing multiple successions and eating the delicious flowers will help you enjoy this plant for a longer season! Wasabi arugula is high in vitamin A, and arugula is a source of other important vitamins such as vitamin K and vitamin B-9. Pkt \$3.50



COMMON ARUGULA #OG106 (Eruca sativa) This delicious green has spicy, peppery, mustard-like flavor, which is great in any salad. We love this green sprinkled on pizza and sandwiches, too. This is one of our most popular greens and is a great staple in any garden! With an incredibly high germination rate, lovely crunch, and tolerance for cool weather, some call this the perfect cold-weather green. Plant densely first thing in the spring and trim regularly for tender greens early in the season. Succession plant every 2-3 weeks until the heat of summer arrives. Great for a second planting in late summer for a fall harvest. This garden treat is ready to harvest in as little as four weeks, and can tolerate some frost. If wild birds and aphids tend to ravage your lettuce, try arugula instead. It is drought tolerant and incredibly easy to grow, but watch out—chickens love it, too! **Pkt \$2.75**



WILD ROCKET #OG107 (Diplotaxis tenuifolia) Reap the intense nutritional benefits of this wild green! Wild Rocket arugula is the perfect marriage of gourmet flavor and wild-foraged nutrient density. The mouth-watering spicy flavor of these greens is an indicator of the presence of glucosinolates, which are broken down by the body into powerful compounds that scientists say may have the ability to fight cell damage and even some cancers. Rocket is also replete with calcium and vitamins, especially A and K, as well as zeaxanthin and lutein, which have been shown to support eye and vision health. **Pkt \$3.00**

RED DRAGON #OG134

(Eruca sativa) 45-50 days to maturity. This arugula with a twist will enliven your culinary creations! Leaves are dramatically lobed in an oak leaf shape with a splash of crimson color. Pkt (100 seeds) \$3.50



ASPARAGUS

Returns spring after spring

(Asparagus officinalis) A beloved early-spring crop in Europe since ancient times, asparagus is a perennial plant that starts slow but yields for many years. The best way to grow from seed is to start indoors 2-3 months before last frost. Be sure that the young seedlings receive bright light to make strong growth. Set young plants outdoors when weather is warm, growing them in a nursery bed of your finest soil, where they will receive attentive care. In fall, or the following spring, set the plants into their final garden location—spacing them 2 feet or more from their neighbors. A modest yield may be taken the second or third year, and a full harvest every spring thereafter.



CONOVER'S COLOSSAL #AS 103 It is no wonder that Conover's Colossal was developed specifically for market farmers: this variety is hearty, vigorous, and sure to please with its buttery, tender spears. This 19th century heirloom is still beloved by market farmers and home gardeners today. Produce merchant S.B. Conover of New York City developed it in the 1860s, selecting for the superior market qualities of massive spears and super high yields. This superb variety has been praised by the likes of famous 19th century market gardener Peter Henderson, as well as the Royal Horticultural Society. Spears can reach one inch thick and remain supremely soft and juicy. This heirloom asparagus is a true culinary delight and not to be missed. **Pkt (40 seeds) \$3.50**



MARY WASHINGTON #AS 101 Easy to grow, disease resistant and delicious, Mary Washington has been the absolute gold standard for green asparagus varieties for the last century. During the early 1900s a fungal disease called Asparagus Rust travelled from Europe to the Americas, ravaging the U.S. asparagus crop. Plant explorer and breeder J.B. Norton, who worked at the USDA and with a group of Massachusetts asparagus growers, collected seeds from all over the East Coast and in Europe. He trialled countless varieties, using advanced statistical data to find successful varieties and ended up with a group of resistant asparagus types that he called Washington. 'Mary Washington' showed to be incredibly vigorous, and resistant to the rust. His achievement was hailed as a huge success for asparagus breeding. This scrumptious and reliable heirloom has rightly reigned supreme in gardens and on farms since it was introduced in 1919. Norton went on to dedicate the remainder of his career to breeding work with the Pedigreed Seed Company, which specialized in, you guessed it, asparagus. Pkt (100 seeds) \$3.00

ASTERS, CHINA

Magnificient for bouquets

(Callistephus chinensis) These gorgeous annual flowers are native to China and Korea but are cultivated worldwide for their showy, ornamental blooms. In the late summer and fall, the blossoms offer a dazzling rainbow of colors that is sure to delight the senses. The flowers can also be brought indoors to brighten the home, as they keep quite well in a vase.



MATSUMOTO FORMULA MIXED #FL352

A stunning rainbow of color from beautiful Japan. A vivid mix of double-flowered asters, with impressive disease tolerance. This blend of bold purple, fuchsia, lavender, pink, red, white, and apricot is a perfect fit for containers, beds, borders, and of course, cut flower design! The sturdy stems reach 24-30 inches in length. 2-3 inch diameter flowers with yellow centers. Asters have long graced beds and borders and cottage gardens. Even the famous gardening president, Thomas Jefferson, was said to have an appreciation for the sturdy and brilliant blooms of China asters. Pkt (75 seeds) \$3.00

#FL395 Fluffy and

The uncommon story of the common chive

aker Creek has long sold Common Chives seeds. But this summer a federal bureaucrat sent us an odd Warning Letter asserting that use of the adjective "common" may somehow violate federal law. When we spoke, she said the "international code of nomenclature" does not list any varieties for chives, so "common chives" might suggest the seeds were a genetic variety or kind that the code does not recognize.

We hired expert lawyers who explained to the federal seed police that American home gardeners do not study the contents of some international directory, and that the U.S. Seed Act does not incorporate the "international code of nomenclature" within its provisions. So it cannot violate U.S. law to use an adjective ("common") that has been used in this country pervasively for decades just because some code does not. (In fact, calling our chives "common" is precisely what the California Department of Agriculture

actually told us we should do!) Our lawyers also explained that the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution protects commercial speech. And the Warning Letter contained no rationale at all, making it null and void.

Our lawyers also told the federal seed police that the common literature has long recognized at least three varieties of chives—common chives, garlic chives, and Siberian chives—and at least sixteen of our competitors also sell seeds labeled "common chives." The bureaucrats have not said they warned them; only us. Doesn't widespread use of the term establish that everyone knows what Common Chives are?

We wrote the federal bureaucrats saying that we were disregarding their Warning Letter as void gave them 30 days to persuade us otherwise. The deadline has long passed and we're still waiting—but we won't hold our breath.

Our bulldog lawyers now insist that we advise you the adjective "Common" DOES

NOT identify any genetic "variety" or "kind" of chives—and particularly not one that appears in the International Code of Nomenclature. Rather, we use "Common Chives" as a brand name signifying the ownership and heritage of these seeds. They have been passed down for generations, and thus are part of our communal or common heritage that connects us to those who have gone before, and those who follow us.

Baker Creek is committed to fighting unreasonable government intrusion into the sale and preservation of heritage seeds. When federal or state bureaucrats overreach or try to impose a unreasonable agenda on American gardeners, we always will resist their efforts.





Chinese Medicine & Superfruit

The powerfully nutritious goji berries are typically only available for purchase in dried form. By growing your own, you'll be able to enjoy the tasty berries freshly harvested! To aid germination, soak seeds overnight in warm water. Plant in a very fine potting mix, and keep soil moist until seeds sprout. First-year plants should be kept lightly watered, but once established, goji berry shrubs can be quite drought tolerant. Caution: May interfere with blood thinners and other medications metabolized by the liver.

BLACK GOJI BERRY #GR159 (Black Wolfberry) This spectacular superfood is native throughout Central Asia. The black goji berry is very rarely found in Western cuisine but has long been celebrated in the Himalayan region as a powerful medicinal and health food. The black goji is known to be more healthful and potent than the more widely known red goji, and we find the flavor sweeter. The tasty, inky black berries are high in antioxidants and are said to boost the immune system and improve circulation. The potent berries create an outstanding blue color when steeped or added to foods. These tasty berries are quickly becoming a popular fruit added to smoothies and brewed into tea. The dried berries are great in granola and muffins or snacked on alone; you can also eat the berries fresh off the plant. Steep the berries into a beautiful blue tea; adding a few drops of lemon will turn the tea a lovely purple/pink color. Gardeners will be pleased to know this exciting berry is highly prolific and easy to grow! Plants thrive in zones 5-10. 'Mary's Niagara' ground cherries impress with their early fruiting, sweet flavor, and compact growth, making them perfect for short-season areas. They could become the new gold standard! 


LACE FLOWER

They readily reseed and will spread, though they are not considered invasive.



LACE WHITE #FL671 (Trachymene coerulea) 100 days. Feather light alabaster blooms create a delicate snowflake motif. Heads reach 2 to 2.5 inches across and float atop sturdy stems. LAVENDER

Famous for fregrance & beauty

This Old World native is widely cultivated as an ornamental addition to gardens and landscapes. Seed will germinate best in a warm location when planted in a light, well-draining medium. Once the young seedlings have developed a few sets of leaves, they are ready to be transplanted. Lavender plants prefer full sun and, once established, are very low maintenance and require minimal watering.





TORCH MINTY ICE #HB342 (Lavandula multifida) Perennial in zones 7-10, or can be grown as an annual. The icy blast of wintermint fragrance makes this a lavender you won't forget. Silvery gray, ferny foliage and spikes of steely lavender-colored blooms give this edible ornamental a frosted look. We love to tuck these tidy, 2.5-foottall plants into mixed container plantings, landscapes, and cottage gardens to add a touch of frosty elegance. Pkt (25 seeds) \$4.00

ORIGANO #HB295 (Lavandula multifida) Perennial in USDA zones 8-10 and annual in cooler zones. Or start indoors and set out acclimated seedlings 2-4 weeks before last frost date. Succession plant lettuce for a continual crop, but avoid long days and heat of early to midsummer. 



Beloved heirlooms of Kyoto, Japan

Cultivated for centuries in the mountainous region of Kyoto, Japan, mizuna is celebrated as one of the region's designated traditional vegetable varieties. During the Kamakura era (1185-1333), Zen Buddhism became popular and along with it Syojin Ryori, which roughly translates to devotion/self discipline diet or the Buddhist vegetarian diet. This dietary trend, coupled with the difficulty of transporting seafood over the mountains, made Kyoto a vegetarian wonderland.

The Syojin Ryori diet is beyond just vegetarian cuisine. This lifestyle promotes eating fresh vegetables in season, to be more aligned with the flow of nature. Mizuna is a slightly spicy, sweet leafy green in the mustard family that is enjoyed fresh year round in this region.

Thanks to centuries of breeding in the cold, harsh winters of Kyoto, as well as its blistering hot summers, gardeners can plant this highly nutritious green almost year round. Mizuna also can be harvested several times within its growth period (often up to 5 cuts) making it the perfect cut-and-come-again vegetable.

Mizuna roughly translates to 'water greens,' a reference to its super succulent stems, which are often pickled. The greens are eaten fresh or sautéed. Mizuna has become popular in the winter farming trend, as it sweetens with cool weather and is one of the most cold-tolerant greens.





BENIGOROMO #OR181 Their flaming serrated foliage tinged in a deep, fiery red flickers like a flame. The crimson-crackled leaves are high in anthocyanin, a polyphenol known for its health benefits and immune-boosting properties. 




MULLEIN



ONION

Grow onions for year-round flavor

(Allium cepa) A very ancient Old World crop—records exist telling how many onions were allocated to the laborers building the pyramids, and they were a basic ration to Greek hoplites (citizen soldiers). Long-day onions tend to do best in the north, and short-day types do best in the south; the dividing line is at about the 35th parallel. Onions grow best in mellow soil, rich and possessing much organic matter. The tiny seeds are usually started indoors, although they may be direct sown if conditions and timing are suitable. Spring-planted onions are started about 9-12 weeks prior to setting out, which may be several weeks before the last frost date. When setting onion plants in their final location, allow about 6-8 inches from their neighbors if in beds, or 4 inches if in rows, spacing rows at least a foot apart. Apply a heavy mulch to control weeds, as onions will not grow large in competition with weeds. Harvest onions when the green tops begin to fall over; cure several weeks and store at cool room temperature. (300+ seeds per packet)



AKATAMA SALAD RED #ON 107 80-120 days from seed; small bulbs mature in 30-40 days. Intermediate day. 

Plant about 1 inch deep. Most types require support—a trellis, fence, etc. (Bush types are really short vines and will support each other when planted fairly close together.) The trick is to get them going early enough to take a crop before late spring weather turns really warm, as heat shuts the plants down. Pick edible-podded types frequently, as they are best before the pods become tough. (60-100 seeds per packet)

Indeterminate tomatoes will typically get much taller, requiring staking or trellising, and they set fruit over a long period of time. 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
